These notices shall satisfy two separate but related procedural requirements for activities to be undertaken by the Town of Rollinsford.

REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS

On or about April 11, 2011, the Town of Rollinsford, will request CDFR/CDBG to release CDBG Program Funds for the SEDC/Green View Technologies, LLC. Project. The Town of Rollinsford was awarded a \$500,000 CDBG for the SEDC/Green View Technologies, LLC Project. The Town will retain \$15,000 of the \$500,000 CDBG award for administrative costs and subgrant \$485,000 to Southeast Economic Development Corp. (SEDC). SEDC will retain \$5,000 for servicing costs and loan \$480,000 to Green View Technologies, LLC for machinery and equipment. Green View will operate a used oil recycling facility that processes used oil back into base oil to be sold to lube oil blenders/distributors. The quality is comparable to virgin oil, yet costs less to produce. Two by-products will be produced, an industrial fuel equal to a #2 fuel oil and an asphalt product. The CDBG funds will be used to purchase, along with a portion of the BFA funds, a device known as a clay filtration unit. This unit will be added into the processing pipeline, it is the state of the art, super high efficiency pollutant remover.

Green View is located in Rollinsford, New Hampshire.

The facility will create 25 new jobs, at least 20 of which will be available to persons of low or moderate income.

CDBG Funds: \$500,000. Other Funds: \$870,000+. Total Project Cost: \$1,370,000+.

FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT

The Town of Rollinsford has determined that the project will have no significant impact on the human environment. This determination is based on the assumption that Green View Technologies, LLC. will obtain all permits required and will adhere to all applicable regulations. Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) is not required. Additional project information is contained in the Environmental Review Record (ERR) on file at the Town of Rollinsford, 667 Main Street, PO Box 309 Rollinsford, NH 03869 and may be examined or copied weekdays 10 A.M. to 4 P.M.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Any individual, group, or agency disagreeing with this determination or wishing to comment on the project may submit written comments to Beverly Dionne, Administrative Secretary. All comments received by April 8, 2011 will be considered by the Town of Rollinsford prior to authorizing submission of a request for release of funds. Comments should specify which Notice they are addressing.

RELEASE OF FUNDS

Edmund Jansen, certifies to CDFR/CDBG that in his capacity as Chairman, Board of Selectmen, he consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. CDFR/CDBG's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under

NEPA and related laws and authorities, and allows Rollinsford to use Program funds.

#### OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS

CDFR/CDBG will accept objections to its release of funds and Rollinsford's certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of Rollinsford; (b) Rollinsford has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR Part 58; (c) the grant recipient has committed funds or incurred costs not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by CDFR/CDBG; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58) and shall be addressed to CDFR/CDBG, 14 Dixon Ave, Suite 102, Concord, NH 03301. Potential objectors should contact CDFR/CDBG (226-2170) to verify the actual last day of the objection period (approximately April 25, 2011).
